Larry Brown chosen for People's Choice Award

Larry Brown will receive the People's Choice Award at the Katz JCC Sports Award Dinner on Tuesday, Dec. 1. The event will feature Keynote Speaker Donovan McNabb, dinner, a sports memorabilia auction, and a tribute to honorees. Joining Brown will be fellow honorees Lewis Katz, Lifetime Achievement Award; Leon Rose; JCC Athletics Lifetime Volunteer Award; and Yael Einhorn; David Back Memorial Maccabi Award.

Brown's dedication to the JCC began in his childhood. His mother Dorothy served on the JCC board and Stanton, his father, coached basketball. He spent his childhood summers attending the JCC Camps, played basketball for the JCC in Israel, and later went on to work at the camp and became the director of Camp Aaron. In later years, he was a basketball coach at the JCC and taught children and youth fitness classes. Larry holds the distinct honor of being the first part-time JCC staff member to be a recipient of the JCC Center Service Award. A graduate of the University of Maryland, he has represented Cherrydale Farms for the past 31 years. He and his wife Barbara have been married for 36 years.

Appel Gallery seeking photos

The Appel Art Gallery at the Katz JCC in Cherry Hill is accepting submissions for a juried exhibit, "Jewish Life in Southern New Jersey." Local amateur and professional photographers may apply. Winning photographs will become part of a semi-permanent exhibit in the Appel Art Gallery with a kick-off reception in May 2010.

This exhibit seeks to capture the Jews of Camden, Burlington, and Gloucester counties in two categories — archival and present day. In both categories, the gallery is looking for photos that capture every aspect of Jewish life from ceremonial occasions such as weddings and bar/bat mitzvahs, daily living, including children in day schools and childcare, older adults utilizing agency services, Jewish holidays or ceremonies, camp pictures, as well as synagogue and organizational events. Additionally, photos that capture a unique aspect of the region, such as a synagogue in Camden or a chicken farm in Vineland, may be submitted.

Photographers of all levels and ages are encouraged to apply and submit recent and previous artwork. Hope Kahn of Kahn Photography and Bill Kovnat of K & K Photography will spearhead the selection committee. The deadline for all submissions is Apr. 15, 2010.
